Policy on handling content

- ARMA recognises the importance of freedom of expression in academic publishing and in the production of resources to support research professionals. It does not, however, support the publication of any content in ARMA Insights that may be judged to be of an inflammatory, harmful, defamatory, or offensive nature.
- All submissions must meet the following editorial standards:

- a. Respectful and Constructive Tone

Articles should:

- Promote thoughtful discussion
- Avoid personal criticism or disparaging remarks
- Use neutral, professional language

- b. Evidence-Based Commentary

Where authors make factual claims, they should be:

- Accurate
- Verifiable
- Clearly distinguished from opinion

- c. Inclusivity and Fairness

Submissions should avoid:

- Discriminatory or exclusionary language
- Political or ideological commentary unrelated to research management
- Stereotypes or generalisations about groups, institutions, or individuals

- d. Avoidance of Inflammatory Content

Inflammatory content includes:

- Personal attacks or unfounded accusations
- Emotive or sensationalised language intended to provoke
- Misrepresentation of issues or evidence
- Hostile or divisive commentary

- The Editorial Working Group will not take forward for publication submissions judged to be of a derogatory nature; that contain incorrect information; or that take the form of an explicit endorsement for the commercial provider of a service, system, or platform.
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
